

What we do in school




- All year groups have focused on an aspect of online safety in Autumn Term 1 in discrete computing lessons

Stay safe online

Remember the 5 SMART rules when using the internet and mobile phones.



S

SAFE: Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information – such as your full name, email address, phone number, home address, photos or school name – to people you are chatting with online.



M

MEET: Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents' or carers' permission and even then only when they can be present.



A

ACCEPTING: Accepting emails, IM messages, or opening files, pictures or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems – they may contain viruses or nasty messages!



R

RELIABLE: Information you find on the internet may not be true, or someone online may be lying about who they are. Make sure you check information before you believe it.



T

TELL: Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online.





Profile

Avoid using your full name. Use your first name or create a nickname. Use an image or your Bitmoji as a profile picture.



Privacy

Keep your passwords and personal details private.



Permission

Make sure you have permission to visit and use new apps. Also to share information online especially if it involves other people.



Protect

Protect your reputation by avoiding unkindness when online.



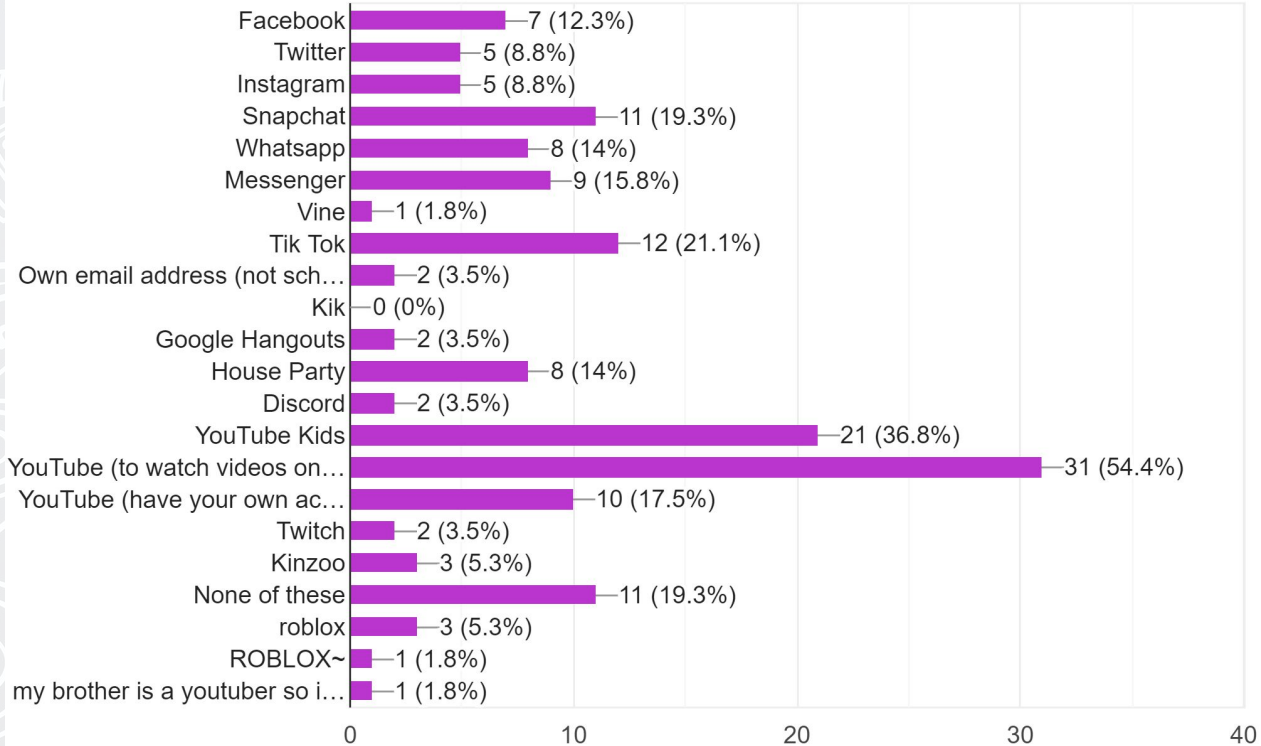

Do you use any of the following?

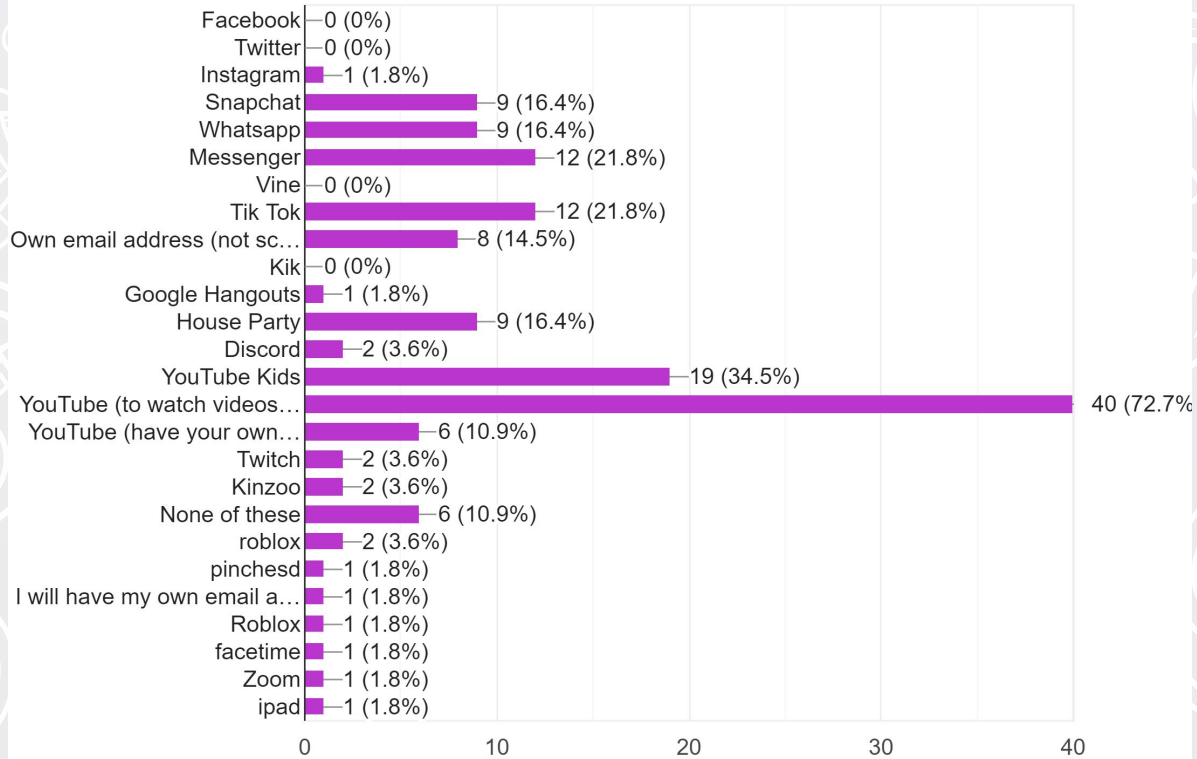

Do you use any of the following?

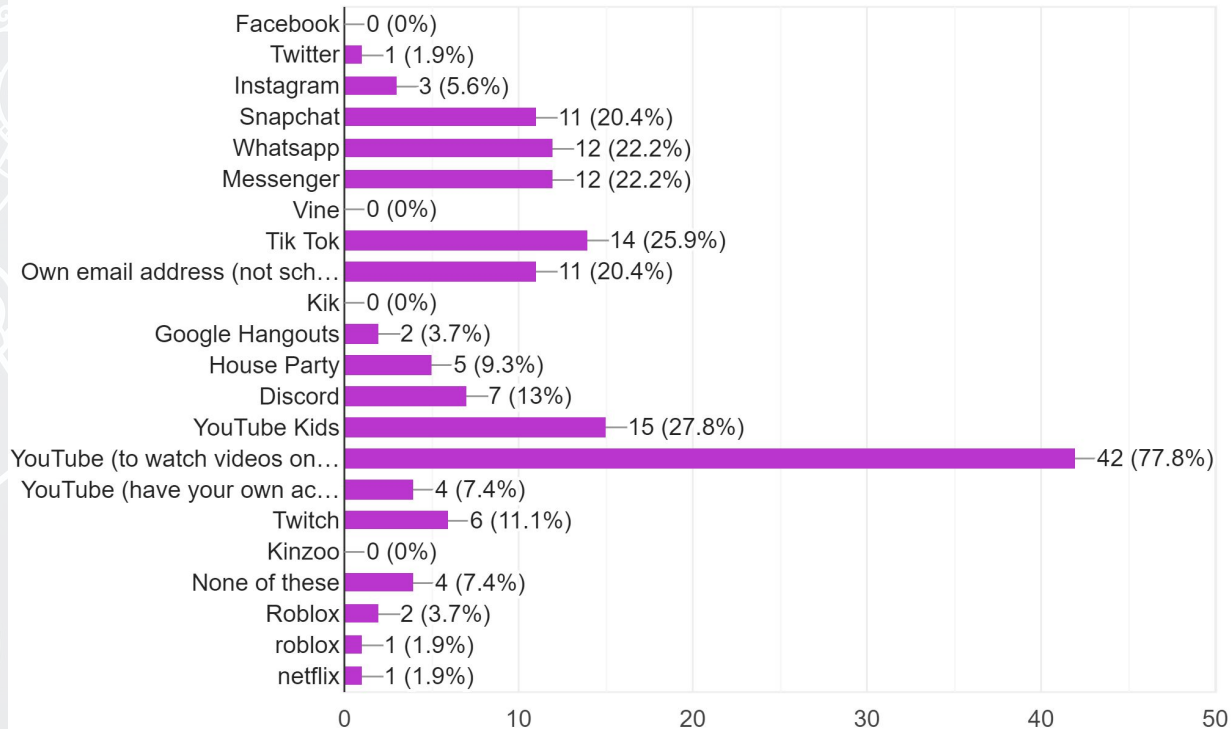

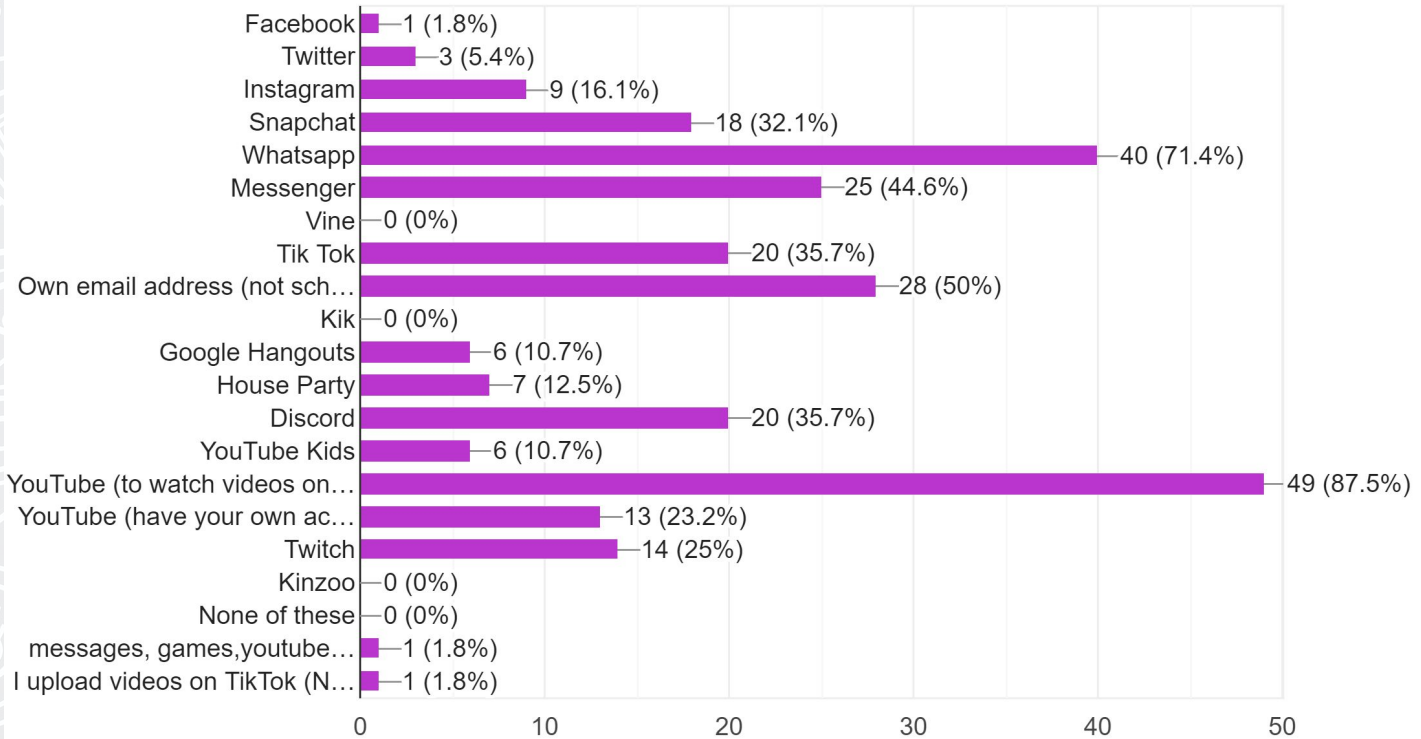

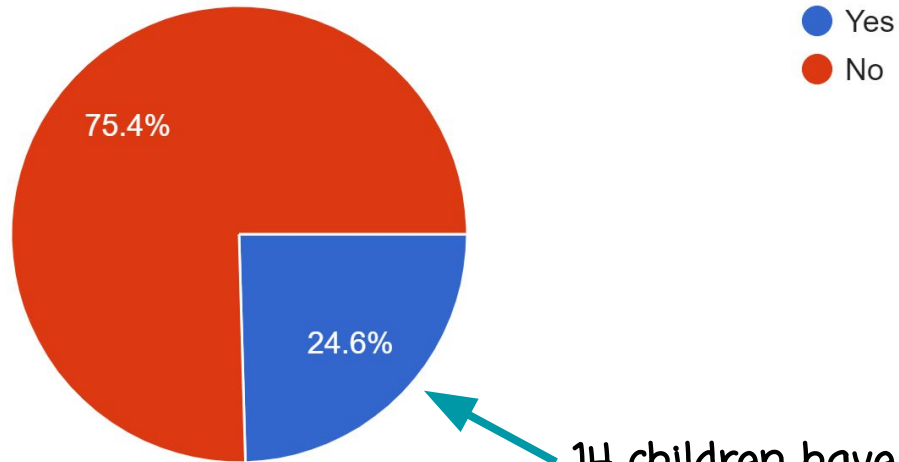

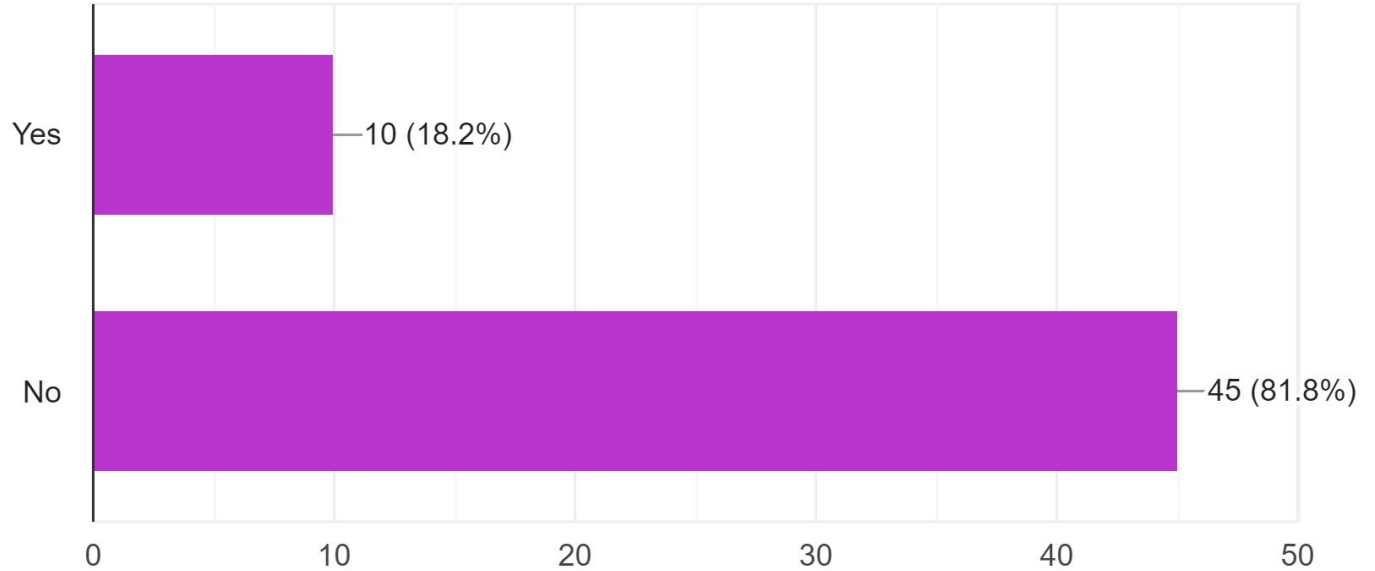

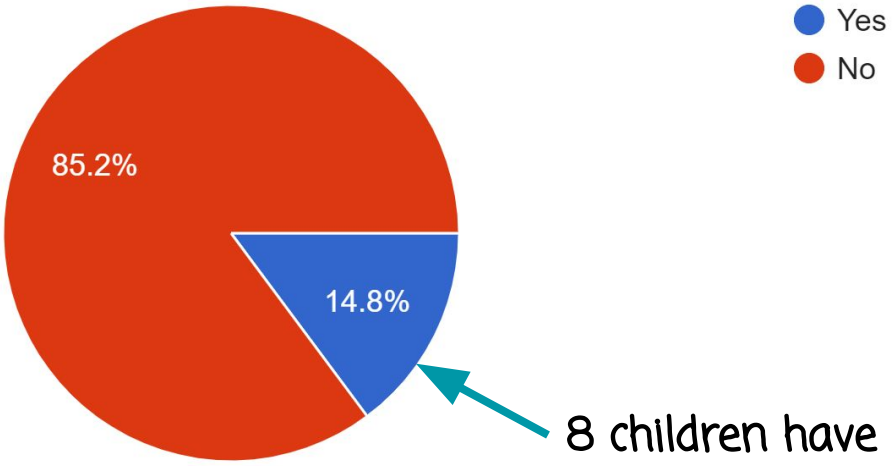

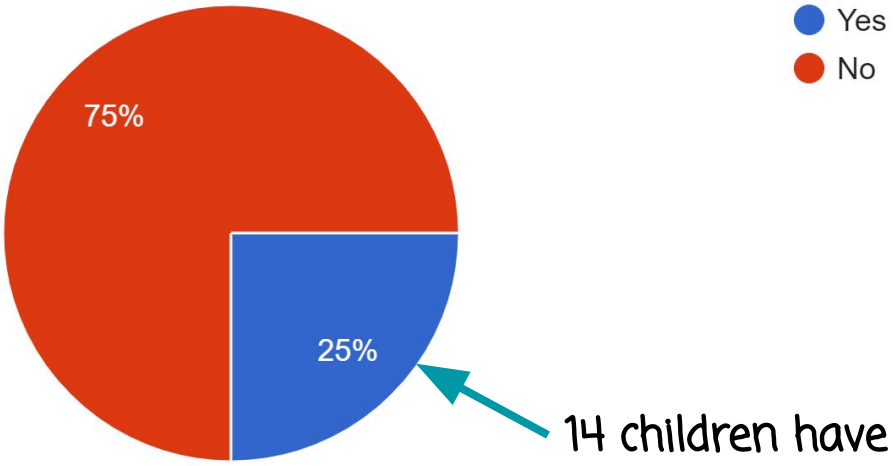

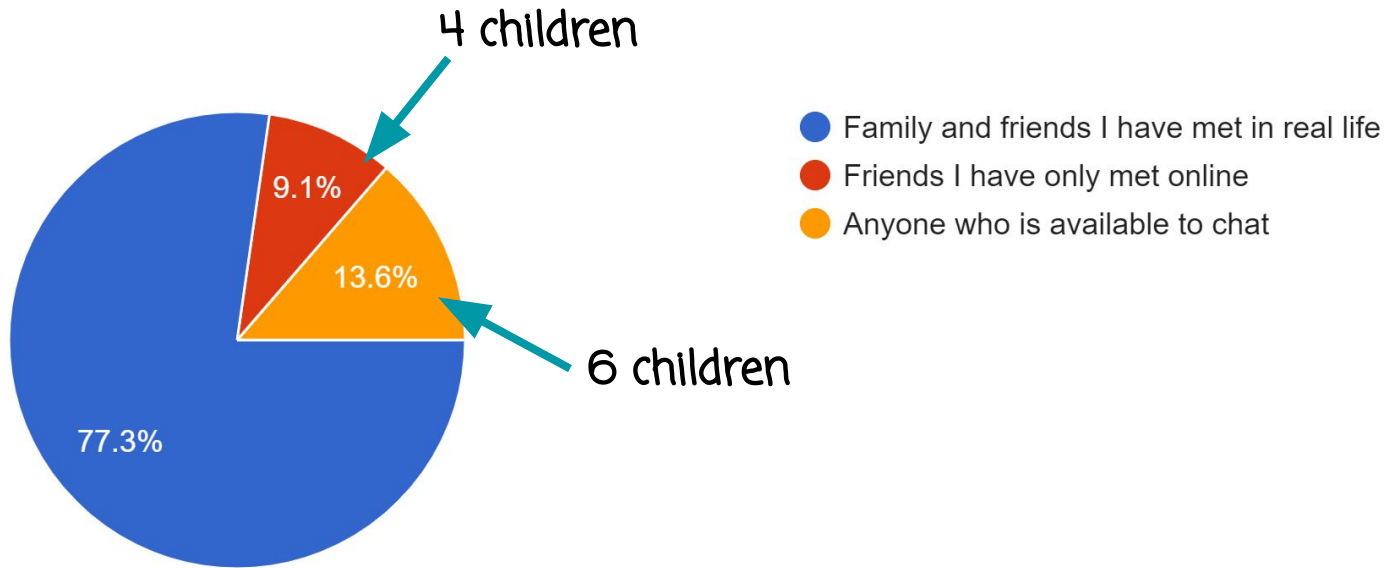

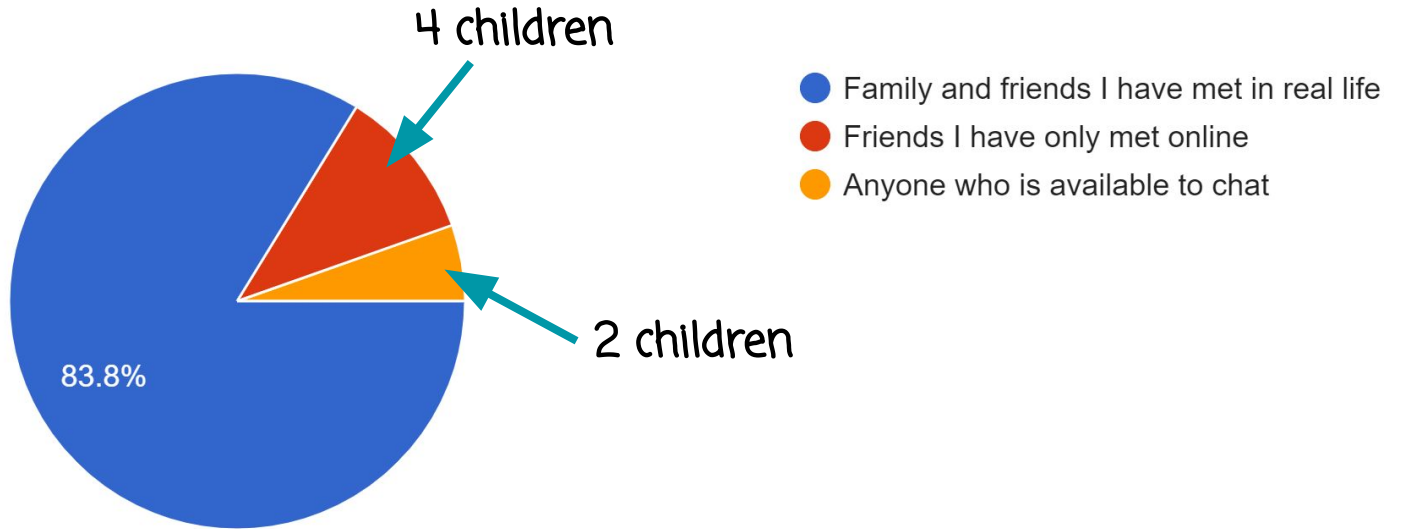

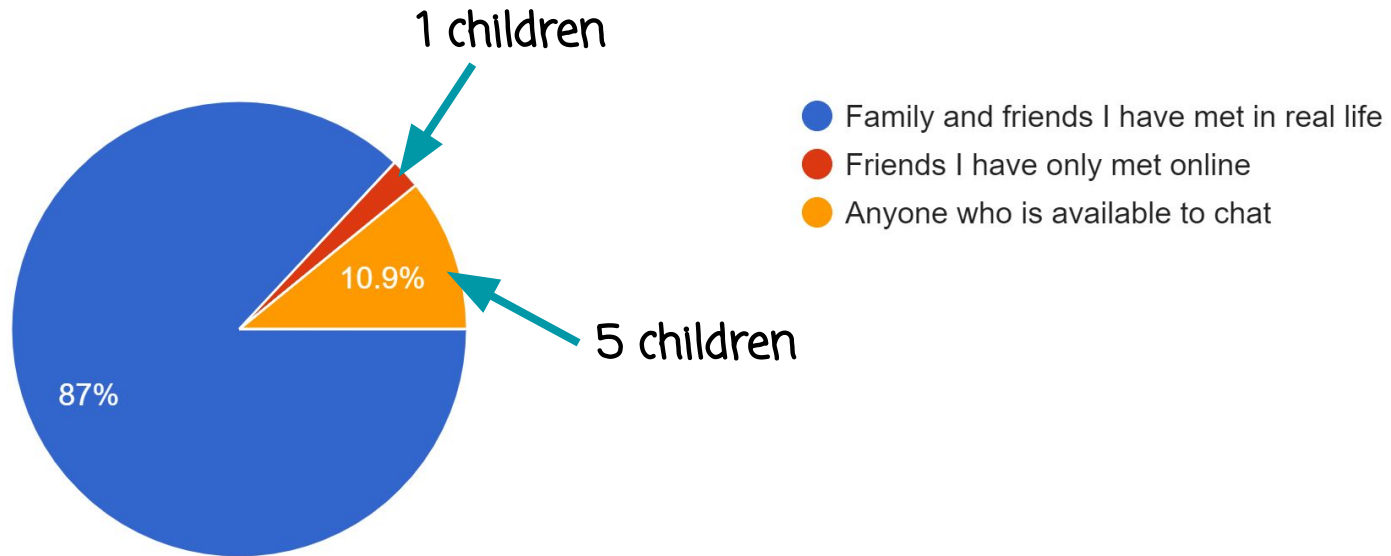

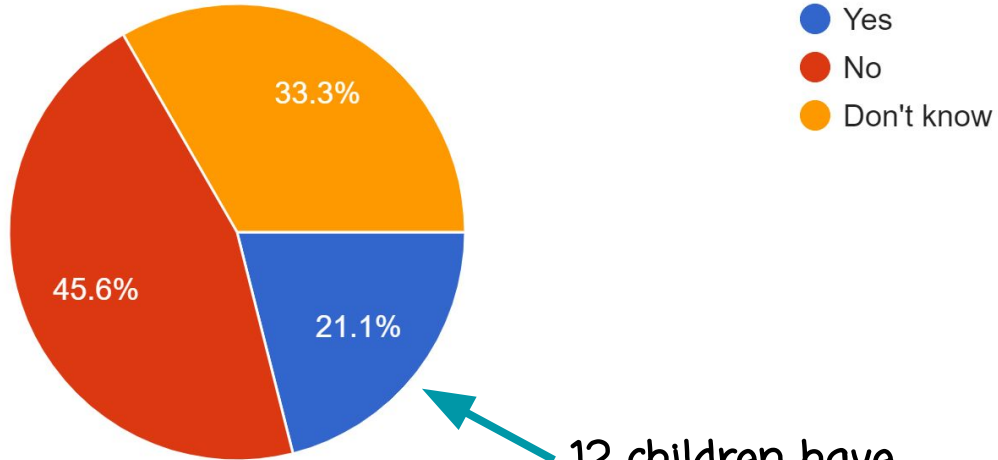

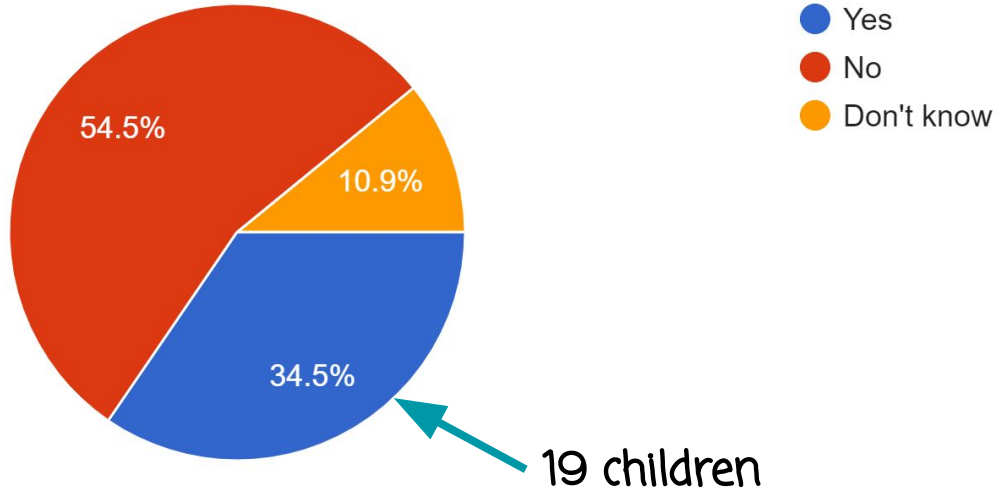

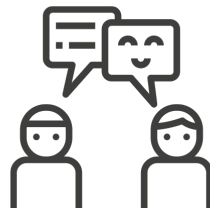
Being respectful online means:

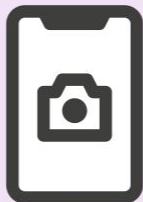
