Learning and the Curriculum – Maths Mastery approach

- Over the last year we have been working with the Yorkshire Maths Riding Hub to establish the best way of teaching Maths to mixed classes.
- With support from Helen Jones who is currently working at a national level through the DFE to support the teaching of Maths in Primary schools across the country. (We have been very lucky!)
- It is an inclusive approach that relies on small coherent steps of learning that build upon the children's previous knowledge. Ensuring we build firm foundations from which the children can make mathematical links.



Learning and the Curriculum – Maths Mastery approach

- A teaching and learning approach that aims for pupils to develop deep understanding of maths rather than being able to memorise key procedures or resort to rote learning.
- Challenge through reasoning and the children's explanations of key concepts. through the use of specific vocab and stem sentences all children have the opportunity to internalise the Maths.



Learning and the Curriculum

- National Curriculum Upper Key Stage 2 Programme of Study for English (same for Y5 and Y6). English lessons have always been the same for both year groups although the finer teaching objectives for each year group differ.
- With support at the start of year 5 as new concepts are introduced and increasingly independent by the end of year 6.
- ▶ In English, mixed grouping allows for a wider range of vocabulary to be taught and for children to learn stronger social and verbal competencies. Children can become strong communicators using language often beyond their current year group.
- Promoting independent thinking, collaboration and effective communication.



Learning and the Curriculum – Wider Curriculum

- The wider curriculum (e.g. History, Art) lessons as a 2-year cycle across the school to accommodate mixed-class teaching. We ensure that all areas of the National Curriculum are taught across the correct phase (Key Stage 1, Lower Key Stage 2, Upper Key Stage 2).
- Curriculum work completed 2023-2024 to accommodate mixed-year planning. Two year cycle to avoid repetition for Y6 children.



Y5/6 Mixed Classes Teacher Training and Support

- Teachers will have their PPA time together enabling them to moderate regularly
- Teachers regularly assess pupils informally (through observation, discussion and writing evidence in books) and formally (with tests and other assessments). Where pupils need extra help, we work on creative ways to support this. This could be in class or through intervention groups.
- Y6 Preparing for the SATs focused time for practice papers and support
- Teachers regularly compare books across the team to compare outcomes and develop consistency between different teachers.
- Pupil Progress Meetings to monitor attainment and progress.



Y5/6 Mixed Classes – How will the Lessons work?

- Most lessons take place as a whole class although staff plan creatively so that pupils are taught what they are needed in the way that will help them learn best.
- Staff may 'differentiate' activities which means that pupils have slightly different tasks, or more support or challenge, to ensure that pupils practise the skills that they need to move on at their level.
- On occasion, year groups may be taught separately i.e. for Big talk (SRE Policy)



Y5/6 Mixed Classes – Pastoral Support

- Will pupils' emotional needs be picked up, and pupils nurtured in a mixed class?
- Emotional needs are picked up in all the usual ways and the Year 6 children will pass on the benefit of experience in class discussions.
- We have a strong pastoral approach in school and work with all pupils on this through daily interactions and specific Personal and Social lessons.
- Dedicated members of staff responsible for additional Pastoral needs (Mrs Savage and Miss Ray)



Y5/6 Mixed Classes – Leadership Opportunities for Y6 children

- Importance that they are recognised as 'top of the Primary school'
